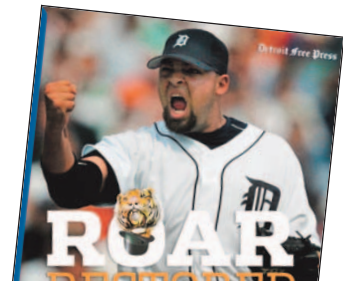

# Plan a great reunion for your family

It's not too early to start planning a family reunion.

SPREAD THE WORD

If you don't already have a family newsletter, now is a good time to start one, to let everyone know about the plans and enable them to clear their schedules.

STAND OUT

You don't have to go all out for decorations. A large vinyl banner to hang from one end of a canopy to the other can be obtained from office supply stores such as Kinko's. Have your family's last name printed on the banner and use it again at next year's reunion.

A sea of matching T-shirts makes it easy for others to spot your group when they arrive. The shirts also help if you have to find a wandering child.

Most parks let you post signs to direct your family to your reunion spot. If you happen to have a candidate's lawn sign, unstaple it, turn it inside out, staple it back onto the stand and write, for example: "Perry Family this way."

GAME TIME

Good old games of baseball, basketball and tug of war always liven up a crowd. Card games are a jump-off for harmless trash talking. Use the rise-and-fly method — you lose the game, you lose your seat — so that everyone has a chance to play.

Those who dare to get dirty can play the egg-toss game. Players divide themselves into pairs; the whole group splits itself into two rows, with the pairs facing each other. Each pair gets an uncooked egg. With each toss, players take a step back. If the egg cracks, you're out. The tossing continues until the last team stands with an uncracked egg. Bring wet naps and an extra shirt.

Kensington and Stony Creek metroparks have beaches. Lower Huron, Lake Erie and Willow metroparks have pools. Metro Beach has both. Bike riders can hit the trails at Hudson Mills, Indian Springs, Kensington, Lower Huron, Metro Beach, Oakwoods, Stony Creek and Willow.

Make sure your area has shade. A canopy comes in especially handy if it rains on your reunion. You also don't want to have a long hike to the restrooms.

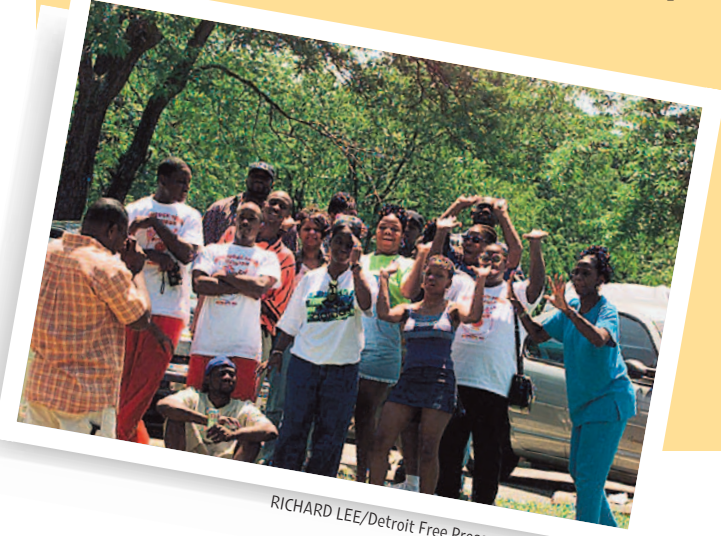
